## CHSAA Guidelines Related to Service, Therapy, and Instructional Animals at State Championship Events

## **Definitions:**

- o Service Animal Any **dog** that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability. (Service animals are specifically defined under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and its Amendments.)
- o Therapy Animal Also known as a companion or emotional support animal and is <u>not</u> the same as a service animal.
- o Instructional Animal Any animal used as part of the instructional process and as approved by the school administrator.

## **Animals Allowed at CHSAA State Championships Events**

Only Service Animals (service animals are specifically defined under the ADA). Therapy and Instructional Animals are not allowed entrance at our state championships event, unless the facility is pet-friendly.

## **General Guidelines:**

- Owner/handler must remain with animal at all times while on site.
- O Animal must be free of external parasites (fleas, ticks, and mites), and free of skin lesions.
  - Owner/handler is responsible to clean up after animal.
- o Animals must be monitored to ensure that they do not demonstrate any aggression towards humans, or other animals, or otherwise create a nuisance situation. An animal's aggressive, unprovoked or threatening behavior, and/or creation of a nuisance situation may necessitate its immediate removal from championships site property.
- o Any request for animal to be on the competitive surface with the coach/athlete must be formally made with the CHSAA Administrator in charge of that sport/activity at least 48 hours prior to the competition start date. The animal cannot distract/interfere with competition in any way, or they will be relocated onsite to a less intrusive location.
