MAJOR CHANGES

A. All regional meets, regardless of the number of teams MUST have no less than 4 officials. The CHSAA assigns post season officials.

2017 NATIONAL FEDERATION RULE CHANGES

3-2-4u NEW	Places the responsibility of providing liquids during competition on the games committee, not the individual coaches
3-6-1	Clarifies that a runner is disqualified by the starter when charged with a false start.
4-3-1b(5), 8-6-1b(4)	Allows the placement of one American flag on each item of uniform apparel and deletes NOTE restricting flag placement.
4-6-5 NEW g, 8-7e	A participant assisting an injured/ill competitor when an appropriate health-care professional is not available is no longer disqualified.
4-6-5h NEW	Adds receiving physical aid by any other person during a race to the list of unfair acts of assisting a competitor.
5-1-3	Establishes the location and spacing of cones, when used, in the absence of a curb
8-1-3b	Clarifies that directional sign posts can be used with or in place of directional flags in cross country.

UNIFORM RULING/LEGAL UNIFORMS

Many of the compression style shorts, whether purchased by athletes or the school, have waistbands sporting multiple and/or oversized manufacturer logos. The CHSAA is asking coaches and athletes to solve this violation **permanently** by sewing a matching solid color material over the band to cover the logos, tucking the waistband inside of the short and stitching the band in this position, using a permanent marker to color the logos to match the waistband color, or any other permanent solutions that will not allow the logos to be seen.

Uniforms will be checked at the starting line. Any athlete that is wearing shorts with this logo violation will not be allowed to compete unless a permanent solution can be implemented in a timely manner. Obviously, it would be difficult to fix this violation at the starting line unless a permanent marker in the correct color is readily available. The start of any race will not be delayed in fairness to all other competitors.

Hats and gloves may be worn by competitors without pre-approval of Games Committee. Hats and gloves must be recognized athletic wear (no floppy hats, or distracting ornamentation), must be used as intended (baseball caps with brims forward for sun-blocking), and must not impede the forward progress of any racer. The above reasonable guidelines will also be extended for runners who wish to use arm warmers, sunglasses, and wrist watches.

CROSS COUNTRY REGULAR SEASON INFORMATION

COMPUTERIZED TRANSPONDERS/CHIPS

A bib transponder attached to the athletes chest or two transponder chips per runner and attached to each shoe must be used. When transponders/chips are used, the official order of finish for runners is that recorded by the transponder/chip.

DISTANCE

The distance to be run in competition (boys & girls) will be measured at approximately 5000 meters. Cross country courses can be 2500 to 5000 meters length as determined by the meet director or games committee. Measurement shall be along the shortest possible route a runner may take. The course shall be clearly marked. This may be by a wide line marked with a material which is not injurious to the eyes or skin, or by signposts with large directional arrows wherever the course turns, or by flags about 1 foot square and mounted on stakes which hold them 6 feet or more above the ground.

DISQUALIFICATION/EJECTION CLARIFICATION

An athlete will be disqualified for the following:

- A false start.
- Interfering with another competitor
- Using unsportsmanlike or unacceptable conduct
- Aiding or assisting another person that could improve that competitor's performance (This will be subject to the official's interpretation and cannot be appealed.)
- Fails to complete the prescribed course that is defined by a legal marking system.

Note: Providing liquids during competition is not considered to be an aid or assistance.

An intentional or flagrant foul identified by a head official/referee against a coach and/or athlete will result in immediate disqualification and the next scheduled contest. The head coach must be told of their or their athlete's disqualification on site by the head official. The reporting official must send/fax a written notification to the CHSAA office within 48 hours of the incident.

LEGAL UNIFORMS:

A competitor may be disqualified for wearing an illegal uniform as outlined in Rule 9, Section 6 (2016 [Track & Field Rule and Cross Country Rules Book](#), page 70-73). (Article 3 is the same rule which applies to track relay teams.) (Refer to page 3 for uniform ruling details)

START/CONCLUSION

A cross country race begins when the competitors are called to the starting line for final instructions and is considered to be official and concluded when places have been determined and the results have been recorded.

Rule 9-3 will be enforced with state adaptations. State meet shall conclude 60 minutes after the last race results have been announced/posted. The state association may intercede in the event of unusual incidents after the referee's jurisdiction has ended.

TIES

Ties in team scoring shall be broken for each classification by comparing the highest non-scoring place finisher from the tying teams. The team with the best non-scoring finisher shall prevail. If one team does not have any non-scoring finishers then the team that does shall prevail.

TEAMS ON STATE COURSE DURING THE SEASON

No teams or individuals will be allowed on the State Cross Country Course the week of state. This includes Norris Penrose and Bear Creek. Due to the course being prepared for the state meet this will eliminate confusion on where you are allowed to be. The ONLY time schools/team will be allowed on the state cross country course for a walk/run through will be on the Friday prior to the state meet from 3:00 pm and conclude by 6:00 pm. Coaches must supervise their athletes. No wheels, and no marking of the course will be allowed. Not abiding by these expectations could result in a disqualification from the tournament.

WIRELESS COMMUNICATION

Wireless Communication - Coaches may have cell phones on the regional and state courses in **unrestricted area**. At no time should a cell phone, any other device or assistive technology (ie: ipad, video streaming, etc.) be used to aid runners during the race. State participants during the race may not have any type of electronic device or assistive technology on their bodies except wrist watches.

DISTANCE

All distances at the regional and state level shall be measured to 5,000 meters.

ENTRIES TO REGIONALS

*Regional directors are responsible for entries into their regional meet. They must contact coaches directly. It is recommended that they begin communicating with teams in their regional at the beginning of the season.

ADDITIONAL RUNNERS AT REGIONALS

Each classification is allowed to run 2 additional runners at the regional meet. 3A, 4A, and 5A may enter up to 9 runners at the regional meets and 2A up to 8 runners. All runners should be listed in the official results but any runners over 7 for 3A, 4A and 5A and 6 for 2A will be pulled out for team scoring. See Below.

SCORING FOR REGIONALS

ADDITIONAL AND INDIVIDUAL RUNNERS WILL BE PULLED OUT OF THE SCORING AT THE REGIONAL MEET.

EXAMPLE for Scoring and Team Results:

All competitors who finish the race shall be ranked and listed in the official results.

In team scoring, up to (**7** – 3A, 4A & 5A, **6** – 2A) team members retain their order of finish. Any team members beyond this number shall be disregarded and shall not displace any opposing runners.

The team score then shall be determined by totaling the points scored by the first (**5** – 3A, 4A & 5A, **3** – 2A) finishers of each team. If fewer than (**5** – 3A, 4A & 5A, **3** – 2A) competitors of a team finish, the places of all members of that team shall be disregarded and the team scores re-ranked.

ENTRIES TO STATE

Coaches are responsible for entering their qualified athlete(s)/team into the state meet. Information on how to submit entries is included in this bulletin (see page 31).

OPEN MEETS

No open divisions will be allowed at regionals.

REGIONAL ELIGIBILITY

Only runners representing member schools and who are eligible (under CHSAA By-laws) for competition are eligible to participate in the regional meet for advancement to state. All schools participating in the regional meet must have paid a separate participation fee for the boys' team and for the girls' team in order to be eligible for regional participation.

RIBBONS

Ribbons will be presented to those individuals who have finished in the top 15 places in the regional meet. Plaques will be presented to the first and second place at each regional meet.

REGIONAL POINTS OF EMPHASIS

All regional meets shall have a games committee, certified referee and a certified starter. (See National Federation rulebook for position descriptions – Rule 9 – Section 4 - Officials.)

Consensus in decision making on the regional level will minimize communication discrepancy between meet officials, coaches, and/or athletes.

STARTING LINE

Starting box placement will be done by random draw per games committee.

APPEALING A DECISION AT THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

If a head coach has an appeal or protest regarding a misapplication of a rule, clerical or scoring errors, or order of finish, they may use the form provided in their packet to file a formal protest at the **Inquiry Table**. The referee will handle all protests. A games committee decision on a case being appealed will be final.

If a coach is ejected for interference with any athlete during the course of the race, the team and coach/individual who interfered may be ejected. National Federation rules permit the referee and/or games committee to eject the team and the interfering coach/individual.

MEASURING DEVICES

Measuring devices (wheels, metal tapes) will not be allowed on the championship course the Friday prior to and/or championship day.

PENALTY: Disqualification from the meet and subsequent probation/restriction penalties based on CHSAA By-laws.

The devices on the course are disruptive to the administration of the meet. Each athlete will run the course at the equitable distance as measured by the site director.

AWARDS PRESENTATION

All individual awards will be presented after each race and all team awards will be presented following the last race of their classification.

CHECK IN

Athletes will receive all information in the team packet. They need to check-in at the starting line. Please make sure two-chips per athlete.

FINISHING RESULTS

The official order of finish for runners at the state meet will be determined using bib transponder and Finish Lynx cameras.

COURSE WALK THROUGH

No teams or individuals will be allowed on the State Cross Country Course the week of state. This includes Norris Penrose and Bear Creek. Due to the course being prepared for the state meet this will eliminate confusion on where you are allowed to be. The **ONLY** time schools/team will be allowed on the state cross country course for a walk/run through will be on the Friday prior to the state meet from 3:00 pm and conclude by 6:00 pm. Coaches must supervise their athletes. No wheels, and no marking of the course will be allowed. Not abiding by these expectations could result in a disqualification from the tournament.

DISTANCE

The race will be run on the site of Norris Penrose Event Center. The course is a 5000m course and consists of rolling hills, dirt, prairie grass and a creek bed. National Federation and CHSAA rules will be adhered to for the state meet.

DOCTORS AND TRAINERS

Doctors and trainers will be provided by the Colorado High School Activities Association.

DRESSING ROOM FACILITIES

No dressing room facilities will be available at the state championship site. All runners should arrive in competition attire.

ENTRIES TO STATE

Coaches (not regional directors) will be responsible for competitor's entries into the "champion chip" system.

The team vehicle/buses will not be allowed to enter on to the Lower Gold Camp entrance, due to the reconfiguration of the race. You will be late if you go this route, as it is a one way now. YOU MUST go to the access road it is across from Daniels Long Chevrolet. Directions listed above.

SCHOOL PACKET PICK-UP

Packets may be picked up starting at **7:30 a.m.** on Saturday, October 28, at the start headquarters. You can pick up packets for all classifications.

- Packets will include: individual bibs (assigned), saftery pins, course map, alley assignments, meet instructions, and coaches passes (2). A list of instructions for the use of coaches passes will also be include.

START/CONCLUSION

A cross country race begins when the competitors are called to the starting line for final instructions and is considered to be official and concluded when places have been determined and the results have been recorded.

A competitor finishes a cross country race when the torso of the runner breaks the plane of the finish line when using hand- or picture-based timing systems.

Rule 9-3 will be enforced with state adaptations. State meet shall conclude 60 minutes after the last race results have been announced/posted. The state association may intercede in the event of unusual incidents after the referee's jurisdiction has ended.

STATE SITE INFORMATION (from Site Director)

The Norris Penrose Event Center:

1. Bus and Team parking information will be included in your regional packet.
2. The Pre-State Meet will be the **ONLY** opportunity to compete on the future state course. As of this printing, all teams that replied **ON TIME** for the Pre-State Meet have been accepted. **PLEASE** do not show up at the Pre State Meet to warm-up on the course. Only accepted teams for the Meet will be allowed on the course. **Failure to comply with this rule could result in team/coach placed on RESTRICTION.**
3. Please police your team camps for trash and athlete gear!

SUBSTITUTION FROM REGIONAL TO STATE

Individual Qualifiers:

If a runner who has qualified as an individual at regional is unable to compete in the state meet, the next finisher shall be eligible to compete in the state meet provided the regional director contacts the CHSAA Cross Country Administrator. No changes will be made once results are submitted to CHSAA .

Team Qualifiers:

A school qualifies a team -- not five or seven individuals -- to state. Team members are eligible for the top ten places awarded at state. All team members must be entered electronically.

DO NOT CALL IN TEAM SUBSTITUTIONS.

A coach of a qualifying team may substitute eligible team members for those who competed at regionals. Coaches do not have to notify the CHSAA on team changes. Regional entries have to be turned into our race coordinator by Saturday, October 21, 2017. Champion Chip information for school entries will be forwarded in the Regional Director's packet. We can make changes up to one hour prior to the start on race day. Every athlete is given an assigned individual number and two-chips for competition. If you substitute a team runner without notification on race day, your runner will be given the name and time of their former team member. Scratch/add sheets will be in each coach's packet on race day. They must be submitted to the CHSAA liaison (in writing) at the race inquiry table - one hour prior to the athlete's race.

STATE PARTICIPATION CERTIFICATE

Each qualifying team will receive a packet containing an appropriate number of state meet participation certificates for each team member competing in the state meet.

Schools with individual qualifiers will also receive certificates for each qualifier when they pick up their meet information.

The purpose of the attractive, suitable-for-framing certificates is to recognize the dedication and accomplishments of all the athletes competing at the state level.

TEAM CHECK-IN

TEAM CHECK-IN

- Team check-in will start at 7:30 am for all classifications. Coach and team report together.
- Team uniforms will be checked and running members will receive a wrist band if the uniform is in compliance.
- Chutes will be assigned. Numbers will be written on the back of the runner's hand.
- Team would then be free to complete their regular warm-up.

RETURNING FOR THEIR RACE

- The check-in tent will be divided into two sections.
- RIGHT SIDE – checked teams with wrist bands. **Each team member will need to show their wrist band and chute number written on the back of their hand. They will be rechecked by officials.**
- LEFT SIDE – teams that still need the initial check-in to get their wrist bands.
- Once teams have entered the restricted holding area they will not be allowed to leave. Coaches and running athletes with wrist bands will be the only ones allowed to enter this area.
- Teams will be allowed into the restricted area immediately after the start of the previous race.
- Team members will be placed into their chutes and allowed to do run-outs by officials who will do a quick check of wrists and uniforms.
- Coaches will be asked to leave with 5 minutes left before final instructions are given.
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NOTE TO COACHES

- Coaches: please note that the warning for an illegal uniform will be given to each athlete at the time they receive their wristband.
- It will be considered an unsportsmanlike act if an athlete changes uniforms once they have been checked in and receive their wrist band. This athlete will be disqualified from the meet, and they will be checked again!



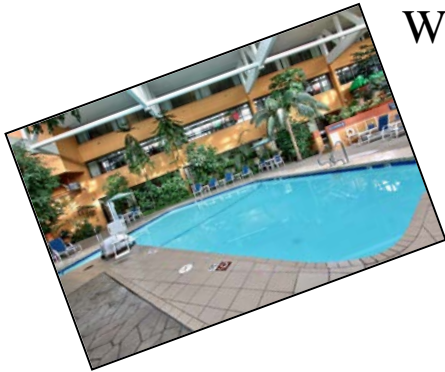
